

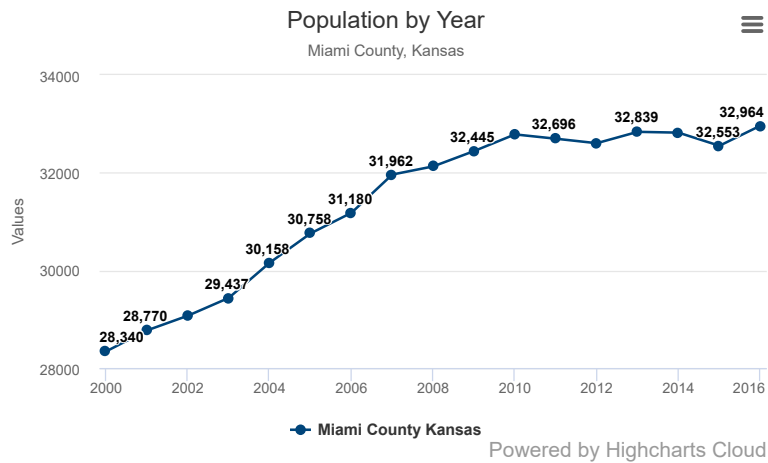

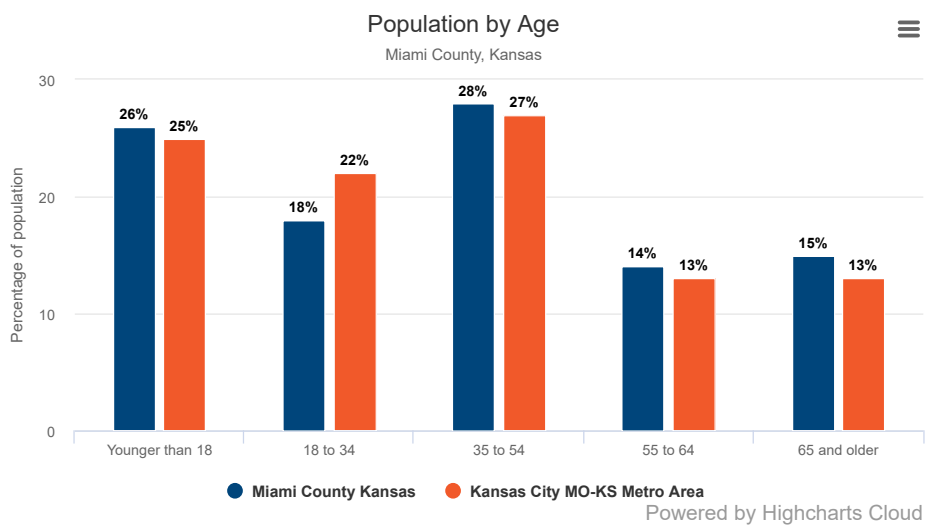

### Population by Year



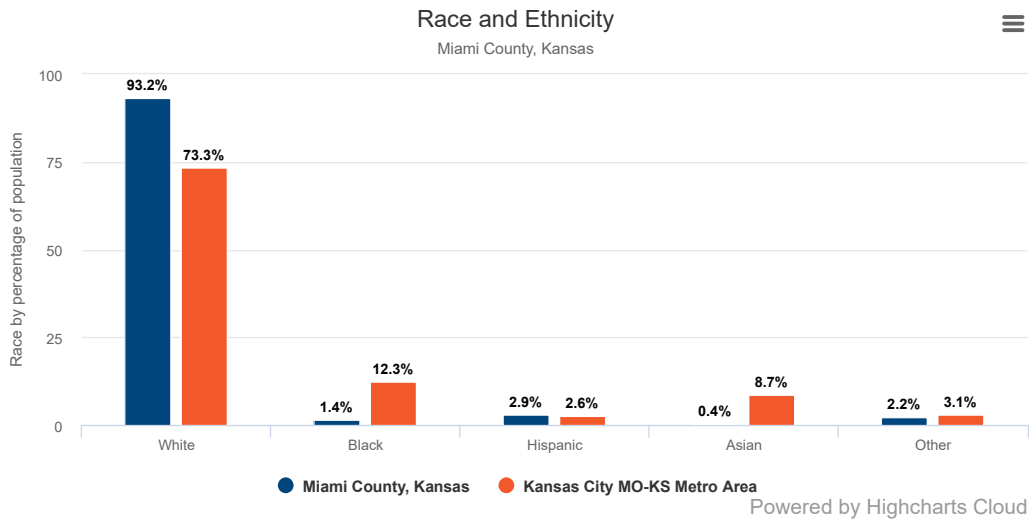

### Population by Age



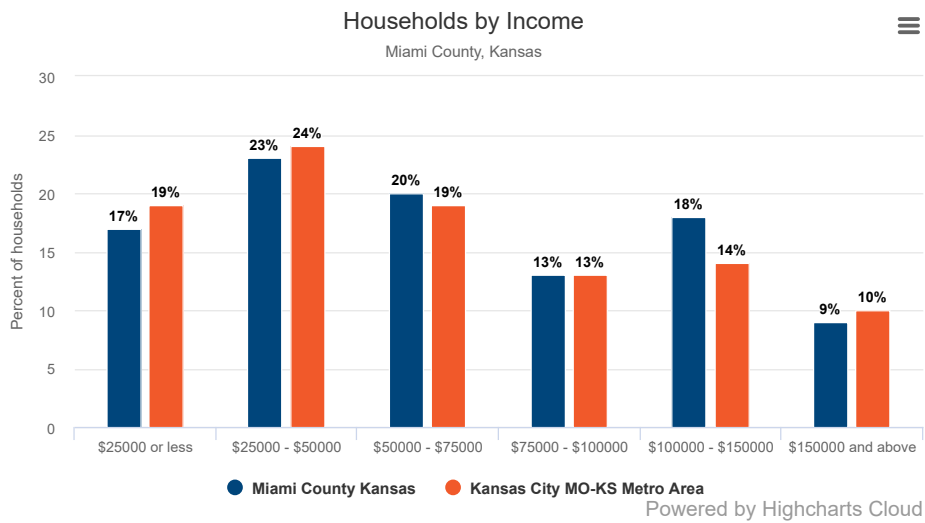

## Race and Ethnicity



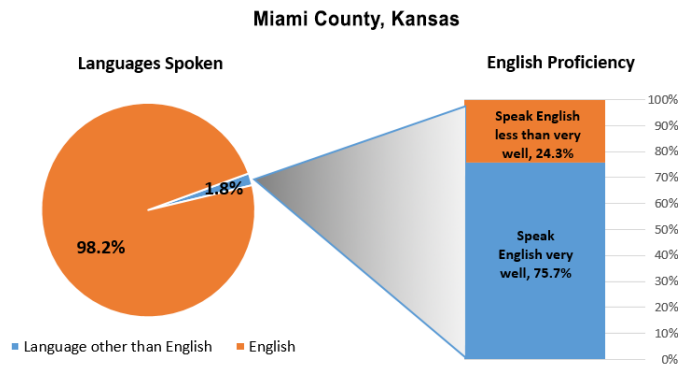

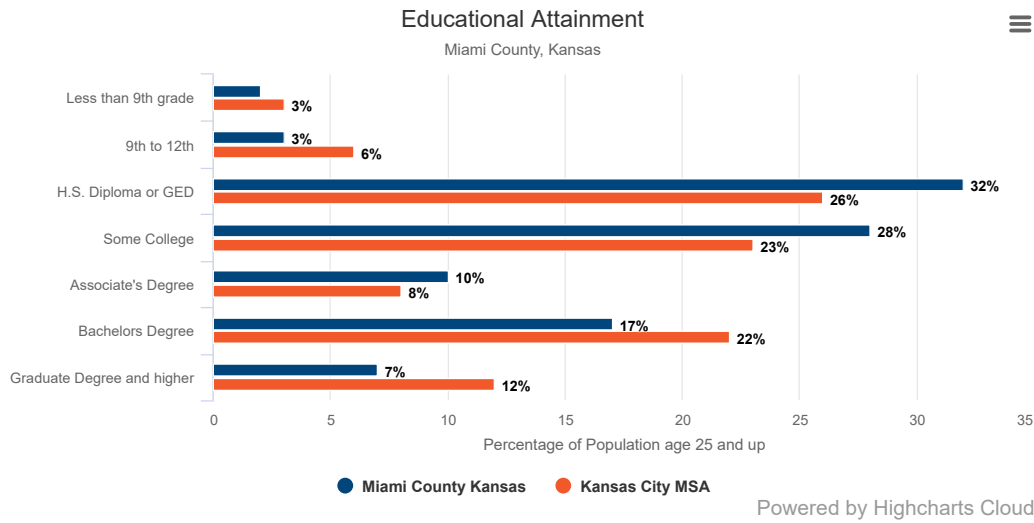
## Language Proficiency

## Educational Attainment

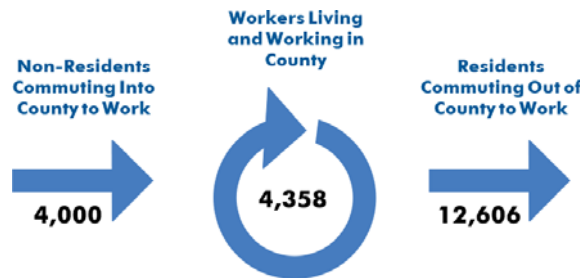
Compared to the Kansas City region, Miami County has a significantly greater percentage of its population with a H.S. Diploma and some college.

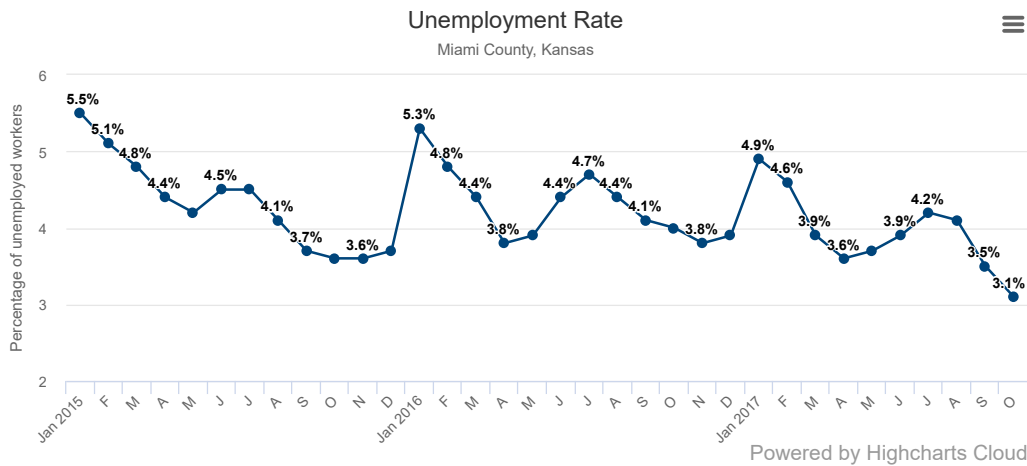
## Workforce Commuting Patterns

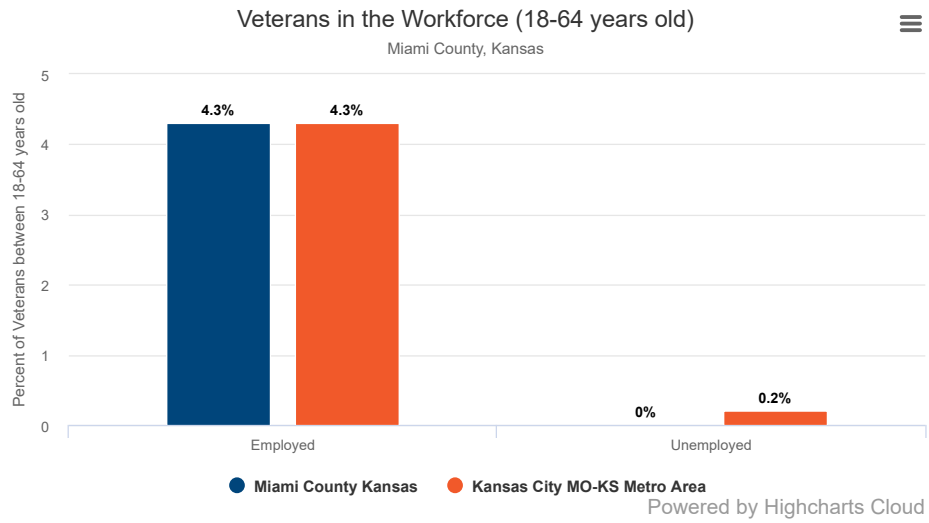

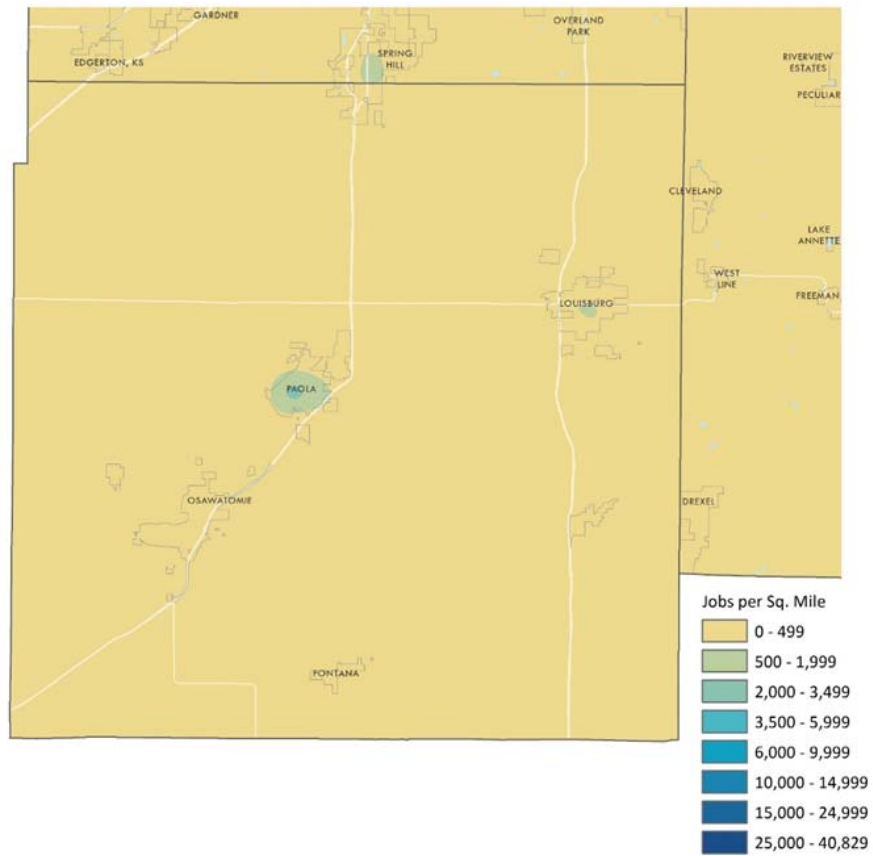
## Employment of Veterans

This map shows where large concentrations of employers reside within Miami County.



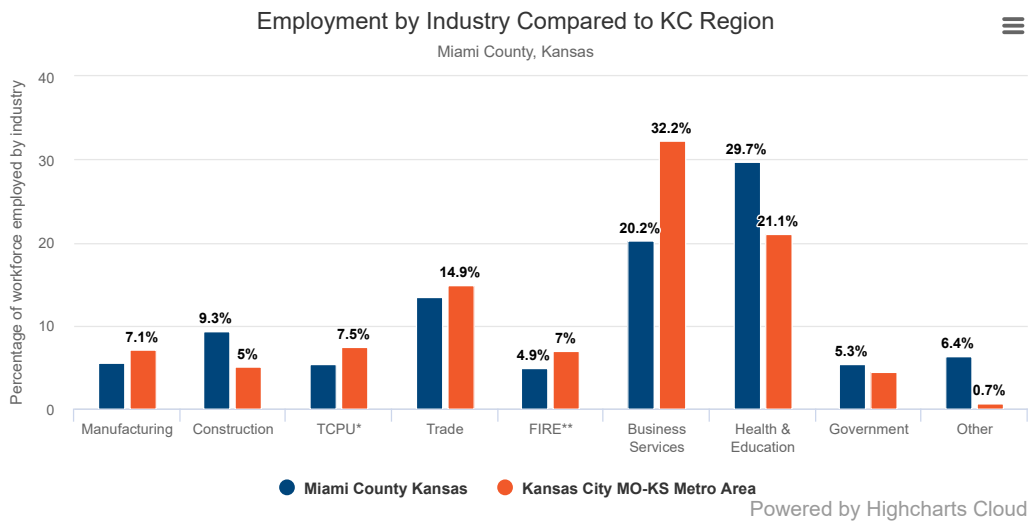
## Competitive Industries

Miami County's top 10 competitive industries are listed by their location quotient. A location quotient shows how the county compares in a particular sector to national numbers. A quotient of one means the county has the same percentage of its workers in that industry as the nation. A number below that means the percentage is lower than the national number, and a number greater than one means the county has a higher percentage of workers employed in that sector.

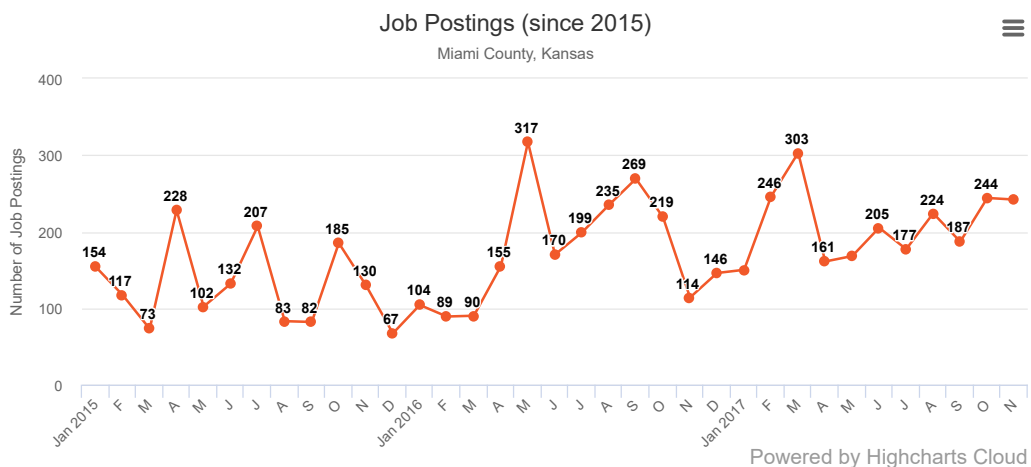
